A Visit to Ensignbus at Purfleet story by *David Hunter.* Images by *D. Hunter & N. Simpson*

Norman Simpson has driven many vehicles in his long working life, ranging from AEC Dump Trucks, underground at the I.C.I. Anhydrite mine at Billingham to the most modern of buses in his present job at Arriva Teesside. One vehicle dear to his heart is the ex London Transport RT class, which he drove in the 1970s at OK Motor Services from their Bishop Auckland depot. His one time manager, Charles Marshall, knew of his admiration for the type and suggested that he contact Ensignbus at Purfleet, Essex, to try to arrange a drive on a preserved example. The Company, which as well as being a modern day bus operator, with a group of services around south Essex, is one of the countries foremost bus and coach dealers.

Approaches were made to the Company and on Tuesday 30th August we made a long journey south to visit their Purfleet premises on Wednesday 31st. We easily found the imposing buildings which are the operational base of the Newman family owned business. Although it was early in the morning there was a steady stream of nicely presented buses in a bright blue and silver livery leaving the depot for services around Romford and Dagenham. We reported to the controller's office; we were due to meet their special Projects Manager Mike Botton. He had not yet arrived, being delayed in organising a rail replacement service all through the night. We made our way a mile down the road to an excellent clean and inexpensive establishment to fortify ourselves for the day ahead. On leaving to return to the depot, Mike arrived in a service van to find us. He is a very amiable fellow, knowledgeable and competent. Returning to the modern office and workshop blocks, they were a hive of activity. After the formalities of licence checks etc we went down through a most modern workshop and MOT preparation area to the main "garage" areas.

There are four "barns", one time grain storage warehouses, but now full of buses of all types and hues, many for sale. but many are part of their fleet of preserved buses which are used for special projects. The special project buses were most interesting; many are ex London Routemasters, Ensignbus being the principal sellers involved in the disposal of these venerable buses following their retirement from front line service.



Most are now restored to an extremely high standard, typical of which is FXT183 RT8, a 1939 built example, which was repatriated from the USA with great care and now holding pride of place in the collection. It really is magnificent, resplendent in its World War II era London livery, complete with high visibility white mudguard edges. Many others are extremely rare, and undergoing careful restoration by a dedicated team of workers of all skills. Notable was a Guy GS used on outer London suburban and country services and a recently acquired Bristol LS/ECW coach once operated by Western National as Royal Blue 2206 from 1957.

A rare Cravens-bodied AEC engined 1947 example had been prepared for us to ride in and drive. It was to be used for filming an episode of 'The Midwife' for Channel Four on the afternoon, complete with driver resplendent in period uniform. After a brief re-familiarisation inspection Norman was ready to go. Mike drove the bus onto the industrial estate service road and invited Norman to take his seat in the cab, carefully checking that he knew what he was about. After one circuit of the block he was "passed out" and Mike joined me in the lower saloon to operate the bell as signals for directions on the preferred route.



Norman drove the venerable and valuable RT up onto the dual carriage way, through the industrial Essex landscape for about five miles and then crossing the new Channel Tunnel high speed rail line via an imposing bridge we gained a road which ran alongside the wide Thames heading east towards Thurrock on the A1090. All too soon, after a forty minute drive we had to return to the depot and park the bus to be prepared for its filming duty. We took coffee in the outside smoking area, chatting to enthusiastic employees. The Company is obviously a happy working environment. A nice bunch of people with interest in their work.

After the break we were taken up stairs to the office block and introduced to the several of the office staff.

To our delight, Peter Newman, the Managing Director made a point of coming out of his office to welcome us personally to the Company. In recognition of his generosity I had taken a copy of the Stockton Corporation book, which we recently published, as a gift, which he gladly accepted.

We had a further productive hour at the premises in which we were allowed free access to all the vehicles, with due deference of course to health and safety, particularly in the workshop area. One area in which the Company is very active is the conversion of double deck buses to open top and single door configuration for operators of the "City Sightseeing" franchises. City Sightseeing is now Spanish owned but originally an Ensignbus operation.

Eventually we said farewell to our genial host for the day, Mike, and made our way happily northwards home. The whole Company is obviously well run and a credit to the Newman Family and their staff. They have kindly invited us down to the South East again to take part in their Winter Running day on Saturday 4th December. We are eagerly looking forward to that.

Rules & Regulations.

1. All riders to meet in the rear car park of Thornaby Fire Station, Master Road, Thornaby, Stockton-on-Tees, TS17 0BQ no later than 11am on Saturday 3rd December 2011.
2. The event will start at 11.30am and follow a route that will have been previously circulated. The pace and direction of the Ride will be under the control of Cleveland Police.

3. The event organiser is Brian Laverick. 40 Pembroke Drive, Ingleby Barwick, Stockton-on-Tees. TS17 5BB. Tel No 01642 751441 or 07968226148. brian.laverick@ntlworld.com
4. The event is open to all powered two wheelers and trikes. Motorcycles that have been adapted to carry a disabled rider will be accepted should the organiser be of the opinion that the machine is suitable for the purpose of the event.
5. All riders and machines must comply fully with all aspects of the law appertaining with its use on the public highway. The rider/machine must be correctly licensed, insured, and have a valid vehicle excise licence and test certificate where appropriate. The machine must also fully comply with The Construction and Use Regulations and other relevant legislation.
6. All speed limits and Traffic Regulations on any road that is being used must be complied with unless directed otherwise by a Police Officer in uniform. It cannot be over emphasised that this is not a race and the last thing we want is for someone to be injured or behave in such a manner to discredit the event.
7. Pillion must be at least 12 years of age on the date of the event. All riders and pillion taking part must pay an entrance fee of £6 and raise a minimum of £20 sponsorship money each. Every rider and pillion will be provided with a Santa suit which is to be worn during the ride.
8. All riders/pillion must agree to and accept the rules/regulations and sign the declaration/disclaimer on the entry form.
