MCN Back Security Campaign. MCN is backing a campaign for manufacturers and insurers to put theft-prevention security marking on customers' bikes free of charge. Some insurance companies offer Smart Water, which attracts an annual fee of £23.99. Another system – Datatag- has a one-off charge of £89 excluding fitting. The reason there is pressure on insurance companies to back the campaign is that data has come to light showing that around 40% of motorcycle theft victims never return to biking, and this is a great loss to the biking community.

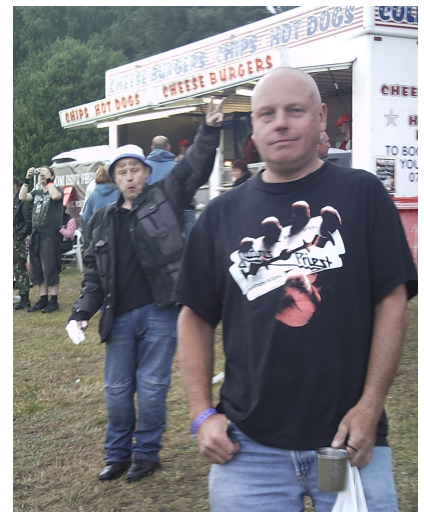
