<u>Riding in France. From Allan Wren</u>. There has been a good deal of debate in the forums concerning the situation with speed camera data in France. It would not satisfy the new legislation if camera locations were classed as 'danger zones' as they would still represent a defined location. No satnavs support POI zones for third party data, as yet.

The legislation requires that police can only inspect your devices after seeking a warrant, or if you are under arrest. So, in reality there is little to worry about. The legislation serves to force manufacturers, who sell in France, to remove the data, and this has already happened.


