European Satnav Update. Those of you who are keen Sat Nav users may be interested to know that the Galileo constellation has reached another milestone. There are currently 2 satellites in orbit and these have successfully come through their full acceptance checks. The next phase is to launch 2 more satellites this summer. This will be followed by an accelerated programme of launches in 2013 so as to have up to 18 satellites in orbit by the end of 2014, providing a basic service. In 2014 a new launch vehicle will be in service, which can carry 4 satellites at a time. The fully operational constellation will be ready in 2019, comprising 27 service satellites and 3 spares. Hopefully I'll still be around then to check it out!

<u>Improved Tracker Service</u>. The Tracker system is now deploying with the Mesh Network. This creates extra defence against vehicle theft whereby any vehicle fitted with the Tracker system can pass information on any other Tracker equipped vehicle that has been reported stolen when it passes by. The system is transparent to the drivers/riders. Tracker uses GPS plus the Global System for Mobile Users (GSM) plus VHF radio links; so GPS jammers will not disguise a stolen vehicle.
