BMF INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP DEAL CONTINUED FOR 2013

The BMF. Why not join the BMF as an individual member and save yourself and the Club money? REVISED RIDE OUT PROTOCOL ATTACHED Revision involves a change to add a sentence on personal responsibilities.

YARM MOTORCYCLING CLUB RIDE OUT PROTOCOL (Updated May 2013)

These notes have been prepared by Yarm Motorcycling Club and aim to promote safe and enjoyable ride outs. The notes are based upon the BMF's guidelines for ride outs and are a requirement under the Club's Liability Insurance. For your information guests, who are not club members, will not be covered by the Club's Liability Insurance.

Before participating in any of the Club ride outs please ensure you have read and understood the points noted below.

1. Please ensure that your licence, road tax, MOT and insurance are in order and that your motorcycle is mechanically sound.
2. Please start the ride out with a full tank of petrol.
3. Destinations and routes will be discussed before the start of a ride out. If you wish to leave the group before the destination is reached, please make your intention known before the start of the ride out.
4. When participants are planning their ride out consideration must be given to all riders with respect to rest and refuelling stops. If any rider has any doubts about their own ability, please make it known before the start of a ride out.
5. Please help to promote a positive image of motorcycling and the Yarm Motorcycling Club by:
 - (a) showing due consideration for others at all times
 - (b) respecting speed limits and other legal requirements
- 6. During the ride always keep the rider immediately behind in view.**
7. Try not to ride too close to the person in front, but if it cannot be avoided, try to ride in staggered formation.
8. In the event of a breakdown or other mishap, the bike or rider in trouble should not be left alone. Another rider should stay with them until assistance arrives. Where possible an attempt should be made to make the immediate area safe.
9. Please show extreme caution where horses are being ridden or when sheep are grazing by the side of the road as they may be easily startled by motorcycles.
10. All riders are responsible for their own actions at all times.

Lead Rider Responsibilities.

- 11. As well as being cognisant of all the above, the Lead Rider should confirm that all participants are happy with the conditions of this protocol. If the route has been reconnoitred beforehand or is well known it would be useful to highlight possible problem areas to the other riders.**
- 12. If carrying a mobile phone ensure that all riders have the number.**
- 13. Check the number of riders participating before setting off and confirm the number after rest and refuelling stops. Ensure that all riders are aware of the total number.**

Finally, enjoy the ride.

Club Members are advised to read Motorcycle Roadcraft: The Police Riders Handbook ¹; a copy of which is available to read on Club nights or may be borrowed from the Club by prior arrangement.

A copy of this note will be given to Club members upon renewal of their annual subscription.
