Police Being Sneaky! After the North Wales police were found to be 'guilty' of hiding in a horse box when operating hand-held speed cameras, it has now come to light that the police in East Yorkshire have been hiding in a tractor parked on the side of the road. The tractor has been located on the B1253, which runs between York and Bridlington. A spokesman for Humberside Police has confirmed that officers are using 'unmarked vehicles' covertly in an attempt to reduce the number of serious accidents on the B1253. This is in spite of advice issued by the former Association of Chief Police Officers (now the National Police Chiefs Council) which stated: "Operators of devices should normally do so from positions where they will be clearly visible to the public."

Laser Jammer User Nabbed! Police have warned drivers against putting devices on their vehicles to jam speed cameras after a motorist was jailed for two months. North Yorkshire Police said Nigel Stephenson was jailed at Bradford Crown Court for perverting the course of justice by a judge who also banned him from driving for six months and ordered him to pay £1,000 costs, the force said. Stephenson was arrested after two incidents caused police concern. An officer operating a mobile safety camera on the A59 Harrogate to Skipton road on August 4, last year, picked up an error code and detected audible feedback from his equipment when it was directed towards Stephenson's white Jaguar. Four days later, the same thing happened as Stephenson drove his Jaguar along the A629 at Crosshills near Keighley.

Both incidents were captured on video by the mobile safety camera and Stephenson was arrested, a force spokesman said. When officers examined his Jaguar, they discovered the laser jammer fitted to the front of the vehicle and he was charged with two offences of perverting the course of justice. The spokesman said that Judge Jonathan Rose ordered the destruction of the device and also of a snoopers device fitted to the dashboard, which alerted the driver to the presence of speed cameras. Stephenson was issued with a caution for using a similar device in 2010, the force confirmed.

Smart Motorways. Work is going on to convert many of our motorways to make them 'Smart.' In addition to replacing many miles of steel central barriers with continuous concrete barriers, the opportunity is being taken to fit cable ducting to the barrier tops. The purpose of the ducting is to carry cables for driver information displays positioned along the motorways. Currently the section of M1 between Northampton and the M6 junction is fitted with the 'Smart' system and work will continue to eventually cover the whole motorway system. The ducting is easily recognizable; it is 150mm diameter plastic tubing, coloured purple, and fitted to the top of the barriers. It's expected that these 'Smart Motorways' will bring many benefits to motorists, some of which have yet to be defined. Nevertheless, the current benefits to riders are that they offer a far safer barrier compared to the steel alternative.
