Secretary's Ramblings: The start and end of March was hardly inspiring; cold and wet plus slimy, mud covered roads were hardly an inducement to get on the bike and 'give it large.' Anyway, seduced by the weak sunshine on 3rd March I decided to give Naughty Suzi a shakedown after sorting out the electrics and cooling system. I started badly – forgot that the clutch needed to be pulled in to start the bike! Strange thing is, I always pull the clutch in to start any bike – must have been a senior moment. I took the road to Middleton One Row and the back road to Yarm through Aislaby enroute to Thirsk via Northallerton. The run was spoilt a bit by weaving around potholes and trying to miss the mud dropped by farm machinery after muck-spreading. A hunt team was standing by the roadside near Aislaby and a couple of corners later I came upon a group with some 20 Beagles trotting down the middle of the road. I was courteously waved through when the dogs were cleared to the roadside. Nice. The journey was punctuated with a few back-end weaves as I locked up the rear approaching slimy corners, (sort of like Marquez but about 150mph slower) mostly caused through torque-lockup on downshifts – must adjust the clutch setting! Anyway, Suzi did ok – no misfiring, lights working ok and no coolant leaks. There are still a few jobs to do, mainly replacing grotty bolts and connecting up an accessory relay so that I can add a few useful goodies – phone charger and heated jacket sockets for starters.

Things I don't like about Suzi: Sidestand doesn't sit far enough forward when down – worried bike toppling with slightest nudge. Sidestand is difficult to access when on the bike; must try and fashion an extension. No centre stand. No bungee hooks. Wonder if anyone else with a SV650 has same or more gripes?

An Ad-Hoc Rideout took place on 13 March. The weather was dry and sunny with a temperature a balmy 12C. Eight riders turned out to see the Flying Scotsman at Grosmont and went on to Pickering where they saw the Flying Scotsman again (are you sure there aren't two out there!) before going home via Thirsk. Good to hear that the Rideouts for this year had a good start.

BMF News Update. Roadworks. Proposals to launch a major crackdown on disruption caused by roadworks on local roads and the start of 7-day working are being considered by the Department for Transport. Councils and Utility companies could face paying up to £5,000 a day if roadworks needlessly inconvenience motorists by being left in place when no one is actually working. Similar charges could also be levied on those who leave temporary traffic lights in place after work has been completed. Workers on A roads, which are managed by councils, will either have to work over the weekend – so the project is finished sooner – or lift the works until they resume. Hopefully this will happen soon.

DVSA Scam Warning. Beware of scam emails claiming to be from the DVSA Fixed Penalty Office requiring you to pay fixed penalty fines via suspicious web portals. The DVSA never sends fixed penalty notices to customers by email.

Cooperative Intelligent Transportation System (C-ITS). The aim of the system is to enable communications between highways management infrastructure and vehicle drivers and between drivers to minimise traffic flow disruption. Information such as roadworks, accidents, traffic-light phasing and failures, even parking space availability in a local areas, can be sent to C-ITS fitted vehicles. While this is less of a problem fitting systems to cars, manufacturers are looking at ways to incorporate C-ITS into motorcycles riding gear – particularly helmets. More later as information becomes available.

Manhole Covers. Manhole covers and highway castings become polished and slippery by traffic and are a hazard to 2-wheel users. The UK's leading supplier of thermoplastic road markings has been working closely with the casting suppliers to provide a non-slip coating.
