
Above still makes good sense, we don't want to risk a third spike of infections


We went back to Dumfries via Newton Stuart and the A712 a smashing road, good surface great bends and very little traffic.




As we set off back to Dumfries the heavens opened so we did the short route back to Dumfries via the quick roads. Well it would have been except for the traffic jams.
